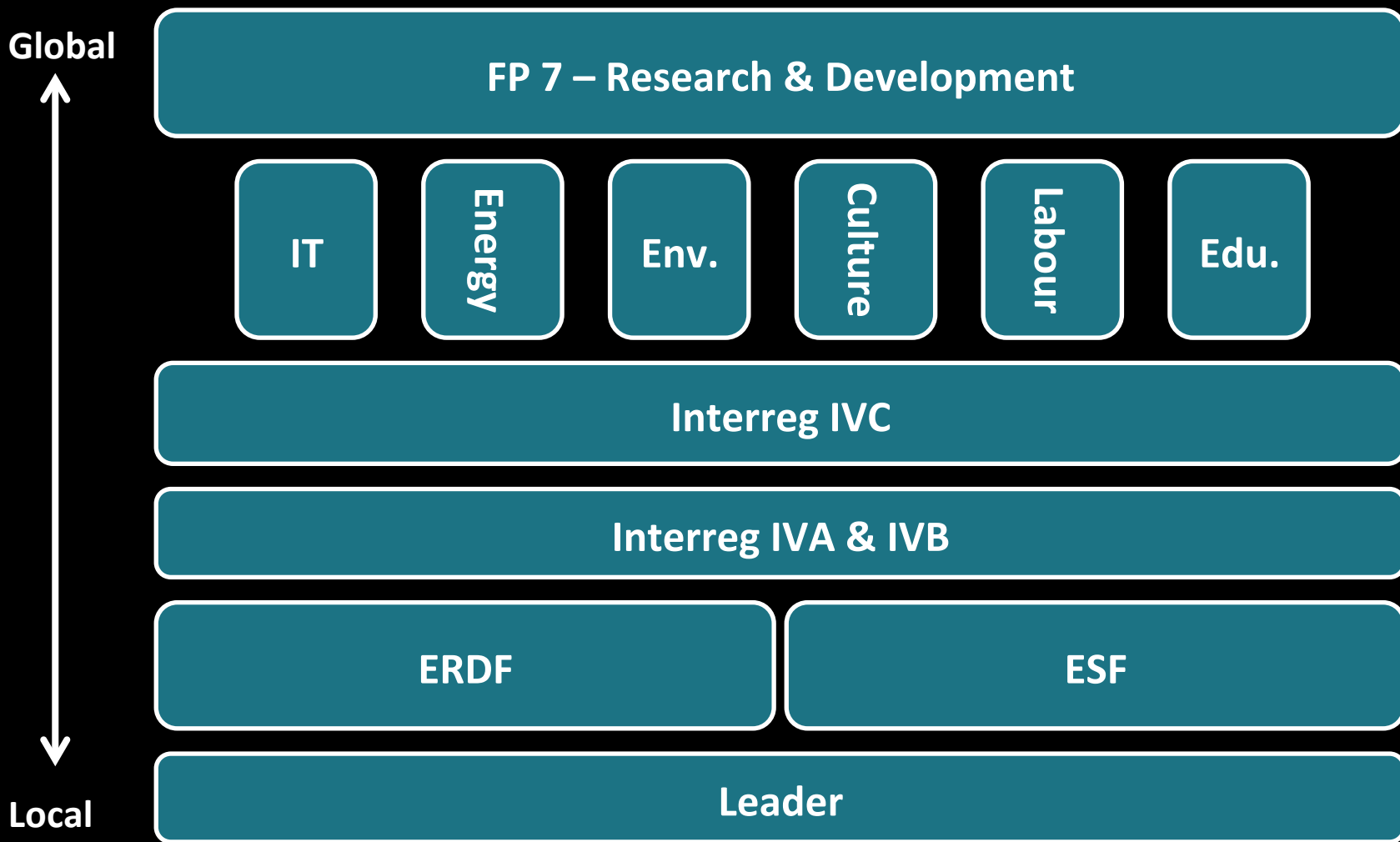

- Raise the level of excellence in Europes Science base
- Support frontier research
- Fund collaborative research in new fields
- Ensure research infrastructure

- A **challenge-based** approach (cross-sectorial)
 - Health, demographic change and well-being
 - Europe in a changing world – inclusive, innovative and reflective societies
 - Establish links with European Innovation Partnerships

Health for Growth

- Help EU countries respond effectively to economic and demographic challenges. The programme will help fund:
 - The uptake of **innovative solutions** to improve health care provision
 - Pooling of resources and **know-how** between EU countries to address common problems

Numbers

- Total budget: 446 meur
- Grants: 60-80% of eligible costs
- Partners: legally established organisations, public authorities, public sector bodies, in particular research and health institutions, universities and higher education establishments

Baltic Sea Region Programme

- Three Thematic Objectives:
 1. Strengthening research, technological development and innovation
 2. Protecting the environment and promoting resource efficiency
 3. Promoting sustainable transport and removing bottlenecks in key transport infrastructure

Co-financing

- 75% for Germany, Denmark, Finland and Sweden
- 85% for Belarus, Estonia, Lithuania, Latvia, Poland and Russia
- 50% for Norway

European Social Fund

The role of the ESF is to increase **employment** opportunities, promote **education** and lifelong learning, enhance **social inclusion**, contribute to combating **poverty** and improve the capacity to serve **job-seekers** better

Proposed common themes EUSBSR

1. Early school leavers and transition from school to work
2. Mobility (youth, labour, informal labour)
3. Capacity building in social sector
4. De-institutionalization and restructuring in health, social and elderly care sectors
5. Support for SMEs
6. Active inclusion
7. Healthy working life

Seed money opportunities

- Swedish Institute
- EUSBSR (IB.SH)
- CBSS – Project support facility
- Nordic Council of Ministers

Proposed changes:

- **Simplified budget – fewer instruments**
- **Combine programs under common frameworks/rules**
- **Higher demands on results, focus and coordination**
