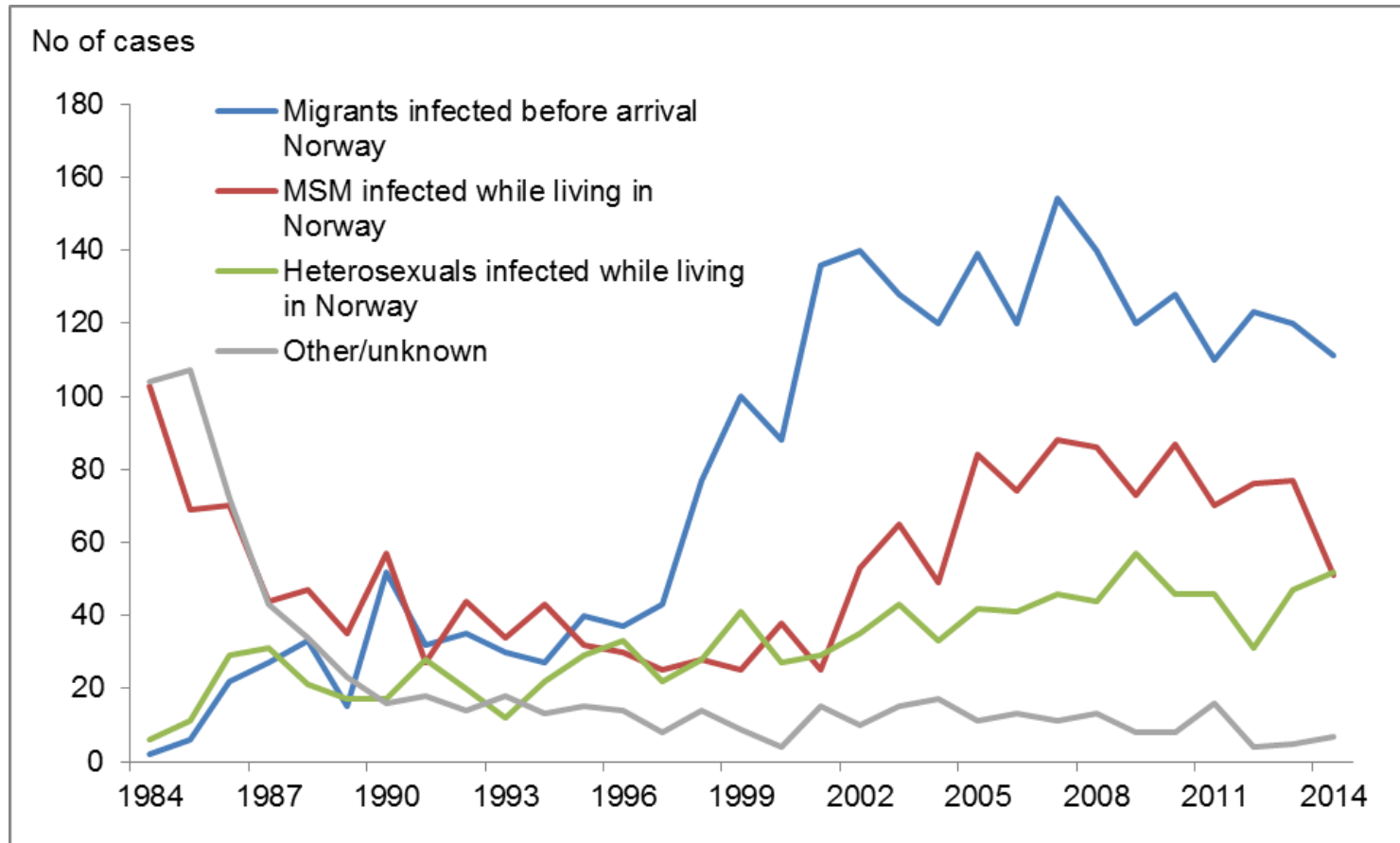

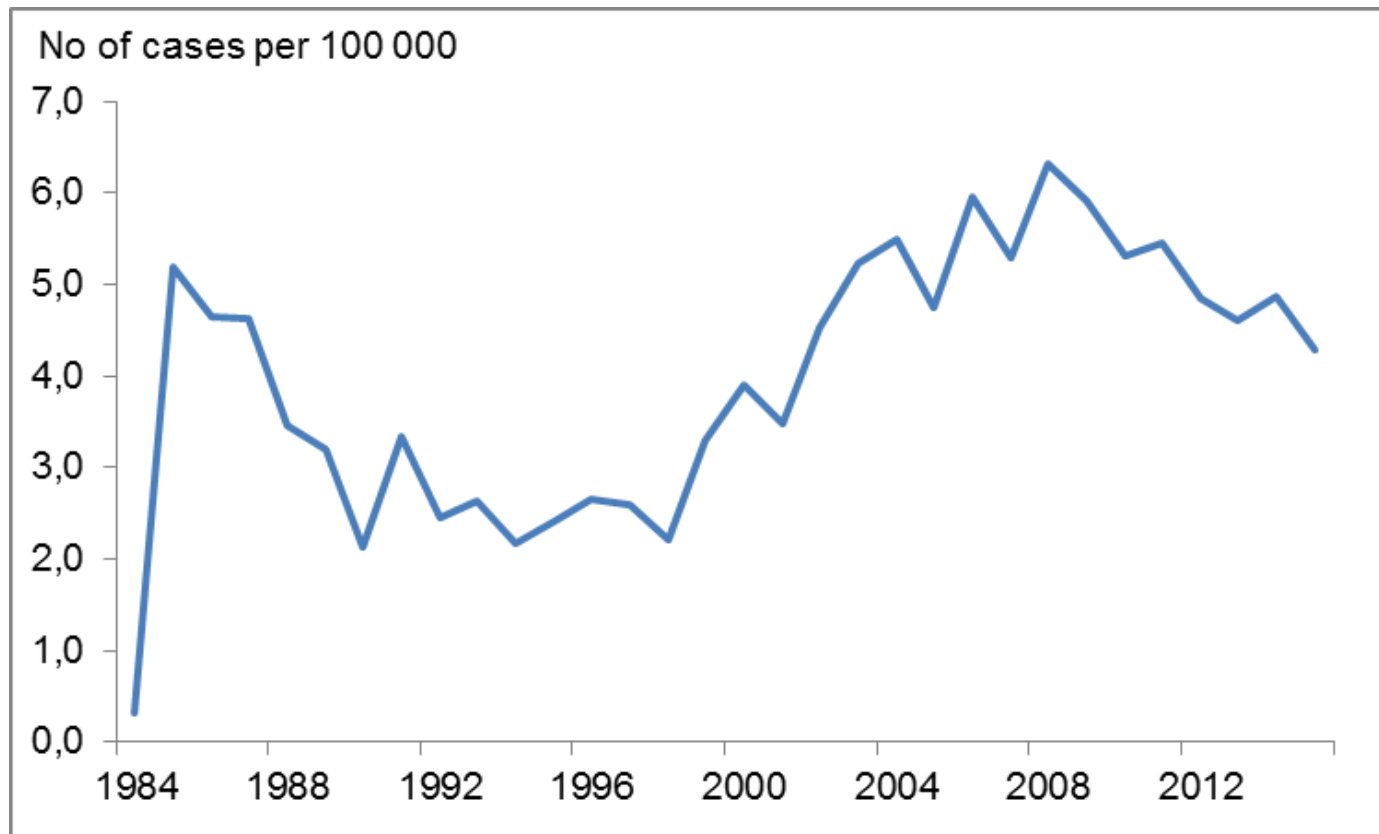

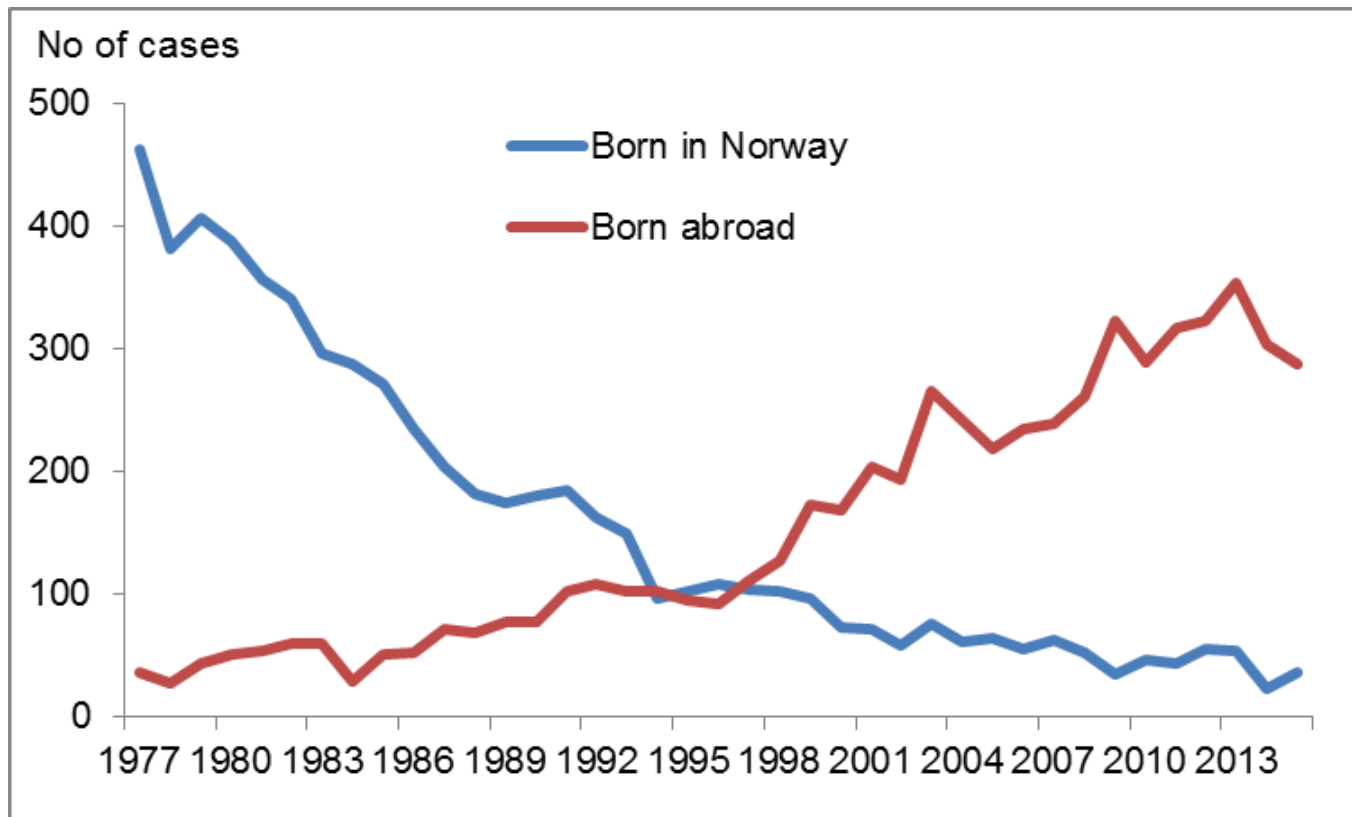
HIV infection Norway 1984-2015 by place of infection and groups

Integration services key populations - migrants

- Tb and hiv-testing of migrants done at different times and by different institutions
- Double infection TB and HIV rather rare – 8 cases in 2015 (3 % of all reported TB cases in 2015)
- Patient with double infection are treated for both infections by same infectious disease department
- A local TB-coordinator follows up each individual with DOT-treatment
- All treatment of HIV and Tb are free of charge

Integration services key populations - MSM

- Testing for HIV and other STIs are mainly done by general practitioners
- Dedicated STI clinics in major cities with testing and counselling for HIV and STIs
- Low threshold center in Oslo for MSM offering HIV - and syphilis rapid tests
- Home testing for HIV through internet planned nationwide

Some important activities and developments Norway - March 2016

- Clear decrease in newly diagnosed cases of HIV among men who have sex with men, but increase of gonorrhoea and syphilis
- Increased use of rapid test and more test sites for men who have sex with men, home tests planned
- More than 90 % of people diagnosed with HIV are on treatment
- PrEP policy in development, will be operative in 2016
- MSM can be blood donors after 12 months quarantine
- No decrease in government funds for NGOs but plans for reorganization
- New National strategy plan for hepatitis
- Considerable increase in number of asylum seekers has not resulted in a dramatic increase of HIV and TB-cases
