- 🔗 Developed for the period until 2020 while the **NDPHS Action Plan** accompanying it focuses on the period until 2017
- 🔗 The NDPHS Expert Groups shall elaborate their inputs to an updated NDPHS Action Plan.
- 🔗 The inputs will focus on the achievement of the objectives and results within their individual remit and cover the period up to the end of 2020.
- 🔗 They shall be submitted to the NDPHS Secretariat by the end of 2017.
- 🔗 Although mentioned in the NDPHS Action Plan in connection with the NCD-related activities, PYLL is not included as an indicator in it (NB. this discrepancy should, preferably, be rectified in the next version of the NDPHS Action Plan).

The EUSBSR Action Plan, Section Policy Area “Health”

- Developed and approved/adopted in **2015**
- The **Policy Area “Health”** was developed closely following the input that had been provided to the European Commission by the NDPHS, does not specify any deadlines for the PA “Health” actions included in it
- Names only two targets with one indicator linked to them. The number of potential years of life lost (PYLL; lost years per 100,000 population, aged 0-69 years old) in the Baltic Sea region/ND countries.

The overall Policy Area "Health" goal is to **reduce premature avoidable loss of human capital and is measuring its success through the ‘potential years of life lost’ (PYLL) indicator.**

The targets until 2020 are:

- **10% reduction in premature avoidable mortality (PYLL) in the Baltic Sea Region/Northern Dimension Area;**
- **10% reduction in the difference between the lowest (best) and highest (worst) PYLL rates for women and men among the Baltic Sea Region/Northern Dimension Area**
