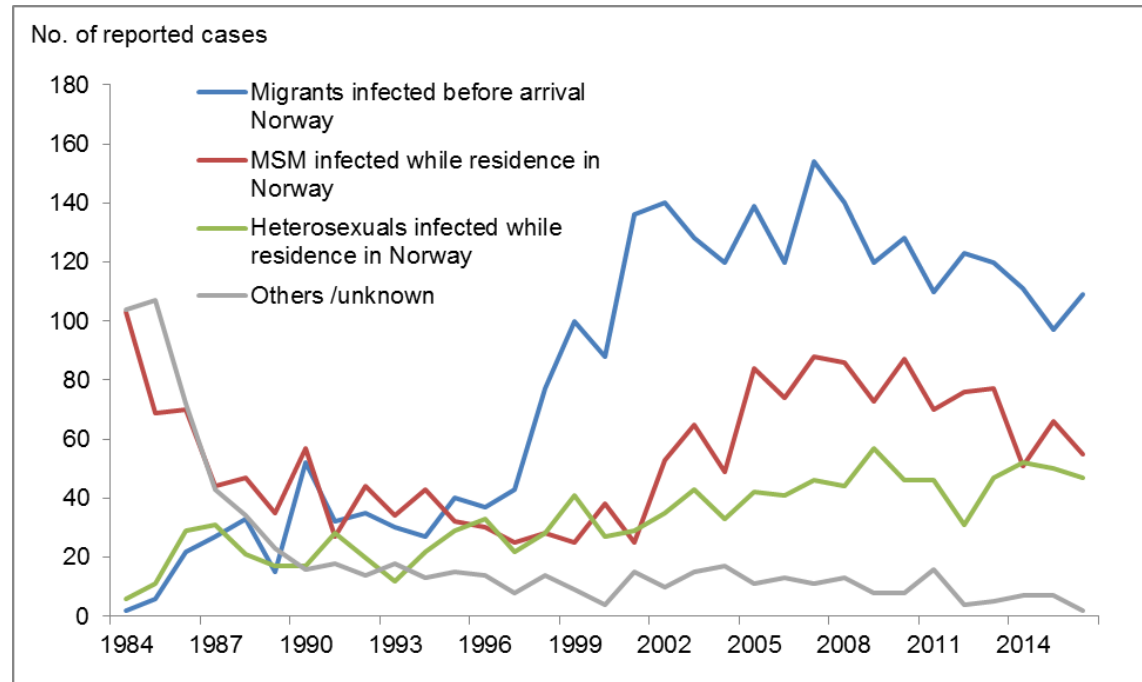
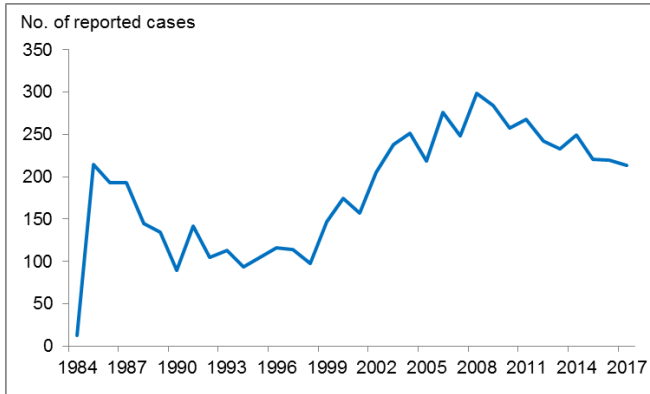

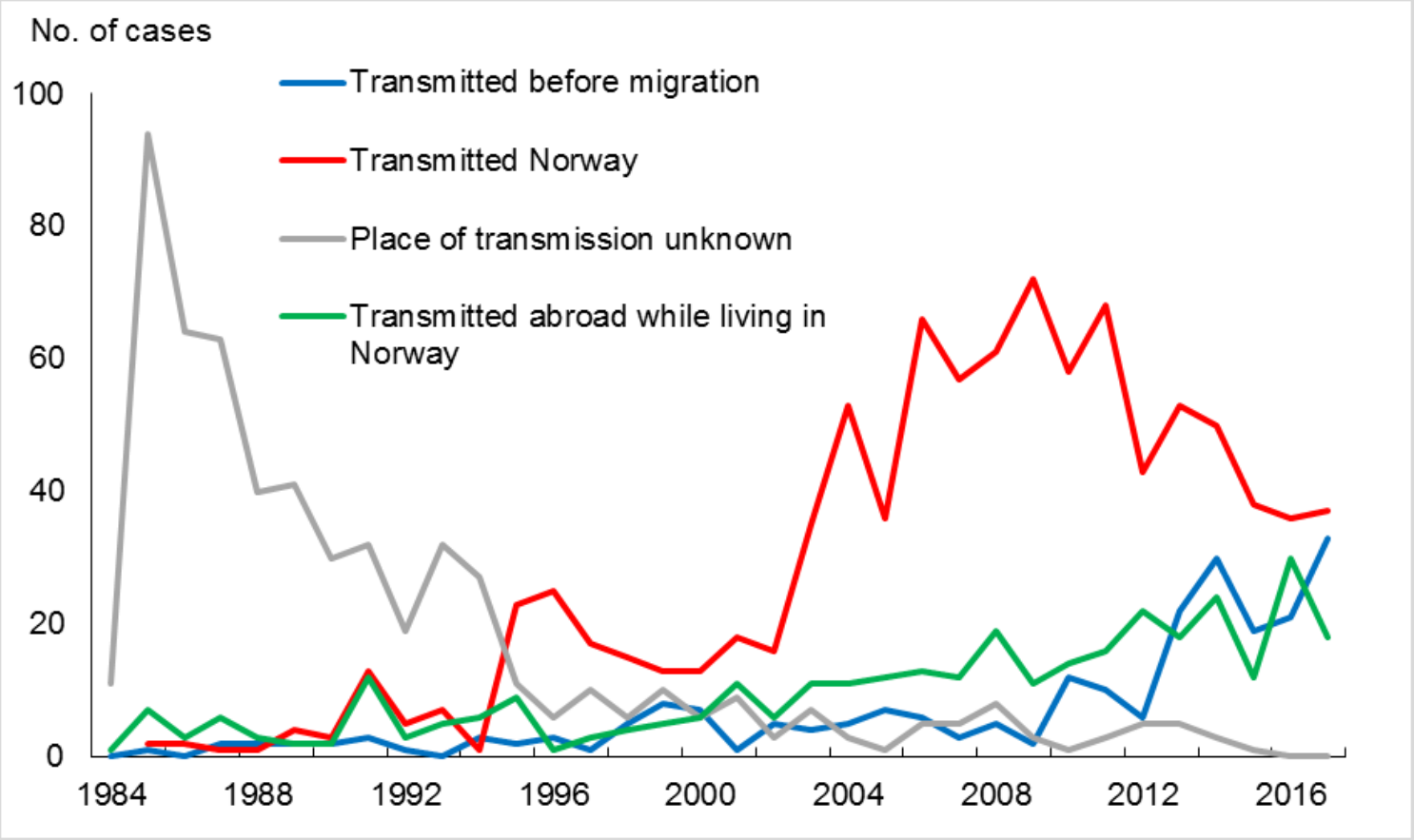

HIV infection notified Norway 1984-2017

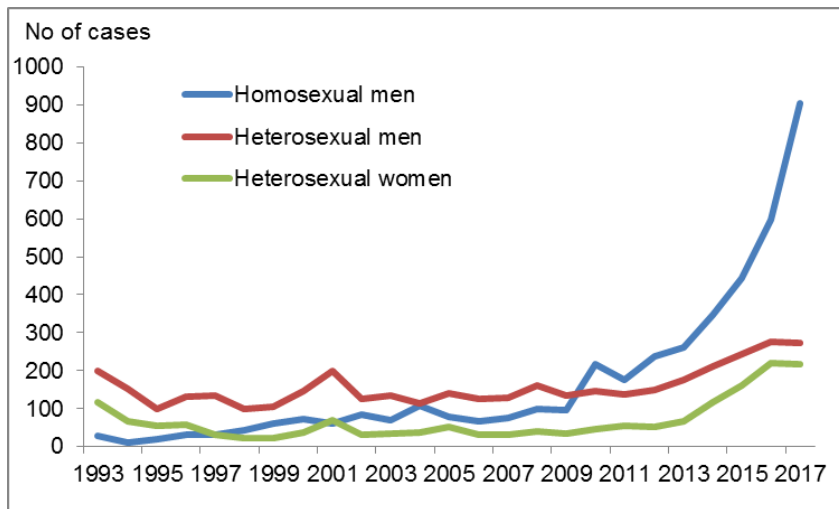


Incidence rate HIV 2017: 4.1 per 100 000

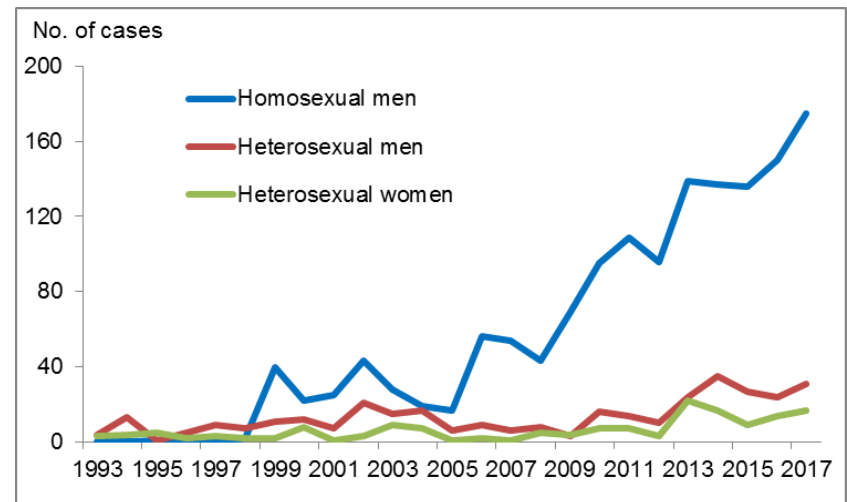
Hiv notification MSM Norway 1984-2017 by place of transmission



Gonorrhea and syphilis notified Norway 1993-2016

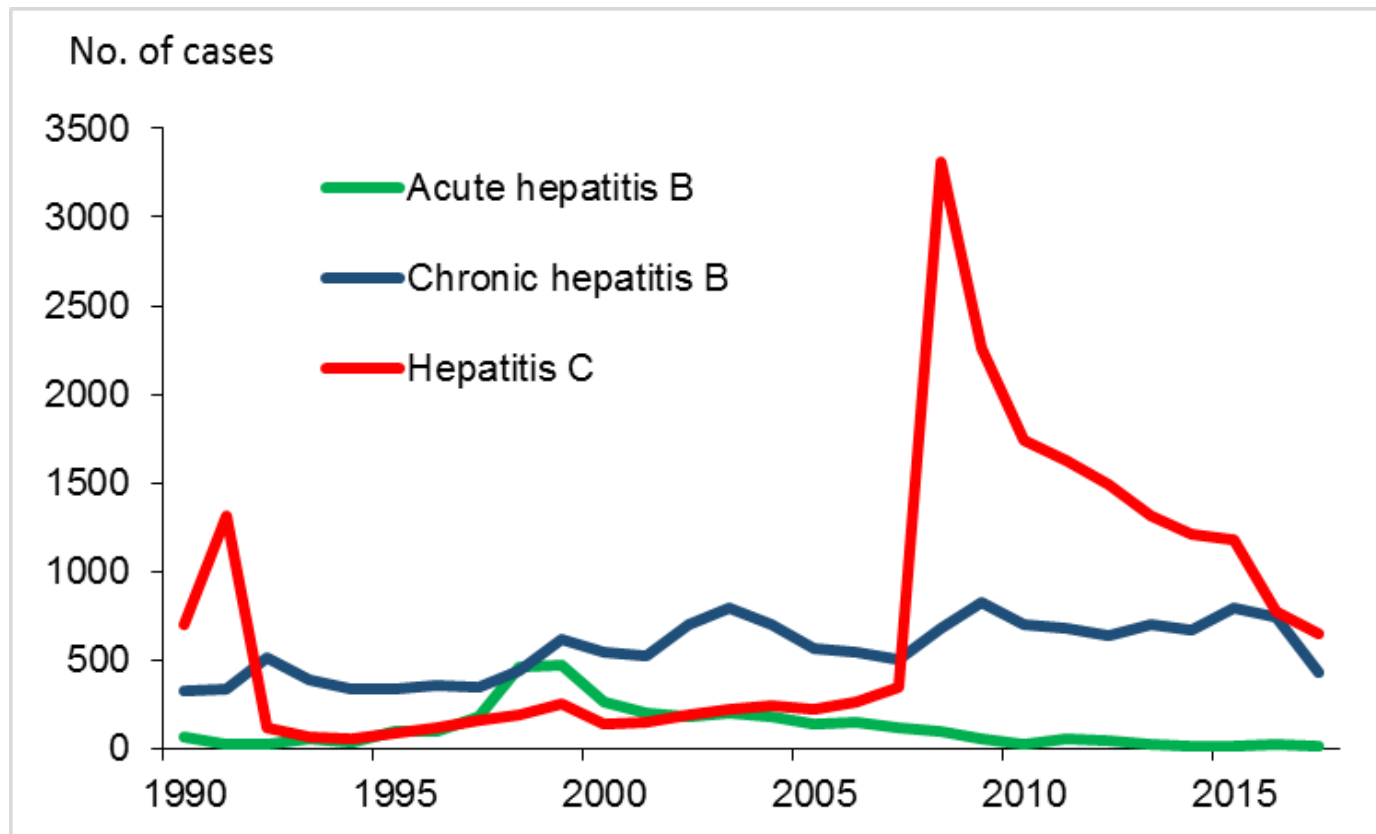


Gonorrhea Incidence rate 2017: 26,0 per 100 000

Some important activities and developments

HIV and AI - Norway

- Over the last few years, decrease in newly diagnosed cases of HIV among men who have sex with men, but dramatic increase in gonorrhoea and syphilis among MSM
- Less migrants diagnosed with HIV after arrival
- 90-90-90 goals for HIV infection achieved
- PrEP available since January 2017. By end of 201 around 700 MSM on PrEP.
- No decrease in government funds for NGOs, more cooperation between NGOs
- Universal hepatitis B vaccination in children vaccination program introduced in 2017
- Universal screening hepatitis B pregnant women will be introduced 2018
- New national strategy plan for sexual health 2017-2022 replacing the old HIV strategy plan
- Decrease newly infected hepatitis C cases. Treatment available to all chronic hep C carriers regardless of genotype.
