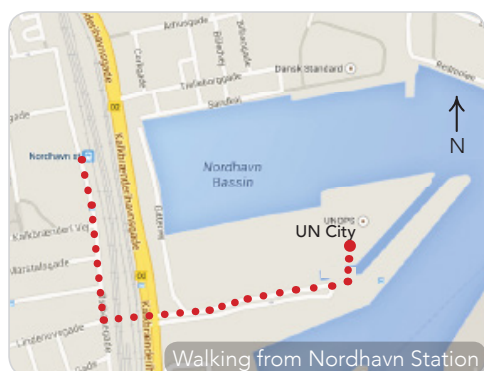


Welcome to UN City

UN City houses 10 organizations—UNDP, UNEP, UNFPA, UNHCR, UNICEF, UNIDO, UNOPS, WFP, UN Women and WHO. The building has around 1500 employees from more than 100 different countries.

UN City is one of the most sustainable buildings of its kind in Scandinavia. It has received a Platinum LEED-certificate and the European Commission's Green Building Award for New Buildings.



How to Get Here

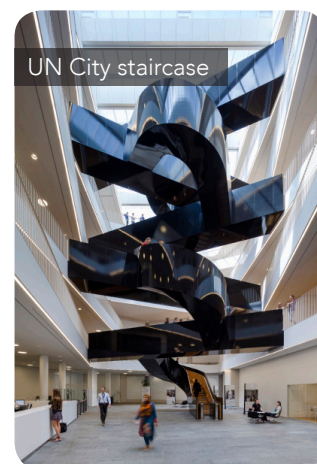
UN City is located at Marmorvej 51, DK-2100 Copenhagen. UN City is accessible by car, but the amount of parking slots is very limited. If you arrive by train, you can take S-train line A, B, C, E, H and walk from Nordhavn Station. If you go by bus, you can take bus nr. 26 from Østerport Station.

Using public transportation, the approximate travelling time from Copenhagen Central Station is 25 minutes while the travelling time from Copenhagen Airport is around 45 minutes.

Security

In order to access the building, you will need to go through a security check similar to that at an airport. Therefore, we advise you to show up early, bring a picture ID and leave any dangerous goods at home.

For larger conferences and events, we recommend arriving at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the program.
